Dear Colleagues,

We would like to invite you all to the 10th meeting of the European Association of Vertebrate Palaeontologists (EAVP) that will be held in Teruel, Aragón, Spain from June 19th to June 24th, 2012. The venues of the meeting will be Congress Hall and Dinópolis, located close to one another on the outskirts of Teruel, Polígono Los Planos, Ctra. Sagunto-Burgos, Teruel (<http://www.feria-congresosteruel.com>; www.dinopolis.com).

The Fundación Conjunto Paleontológico de Teruel-Dinópolis (Government of Aragón, Spain) was founded in 1998 with the aim of managing the palaeontological resources of the Teruel area. Other important goals are the promotion of palaeontological research and the preservation and public dissemination of the Turolian fossiliferous heritage.

Dinópolis has introduced the History of Life on our planet to visitors since June, 2001 and has more than 30000 square meters devoted to the task, combining a Palaeontological Museum (aquatic world hall, dinosaurs hall, mammals hall and human evolution building) and live performances (night-rides, didactic workshops, entertainment activities, shows, theatre). Another five smaller 'satellite' museums are located near iconic palaeontological sites in the province; their topics are:

- How is a dinosaur excavated? In Peñarroya de Tastavins, an Early Cretaceous dinosaur site where the new sauropod *Tastavinsaurus sanzi* has been found.
- How is a dinosaur restored? In Galve, where there are several Early Cretaceous dinosaur sites, one of them the type locality of the sauropod *Aragosaurus ischiaticus*.
- How do palaeontologists classify fossils? In Rubielos de Mora, a Miocene Fossil-Lagerstätte with plants, insects and amphibians.
- What is palaeobotany and how does palaeobotany contribute to palaeogeographical reconstructions? In Castellote, an Early Cretaceous fossil tree site.

- How are fossil sites formed and change over time? In Albarracín, a mountain-range deposited in a Jurassic sea with abundant marine invertebrates and some marine reptiles.

Research on continental fossil vertebrates (mainly Mesozoic dinosaurs and Cenozoic mammals), curation of fossils in the Palaeontological Laboratory and repositories, and public programs for scholars, students and the general public are also developed within the Dinópolis Foundation, which contains the Museo Aragonés de Paleontología (Aragón Government). Teruel is located in central Spain, in the south of the Aragón region. The province hosts notable examples of Mudejar architecture - particularly in the city of Teruel - that are included in the UNESCO World Heritage List.

Other interesting locations in the province are Albarracín, with its Arab fortress; Mora de Rubielos, which has one of the best preserved castles in Aragón; and Alcalá de la Selva, which is very popular with hikers due to its attractive and varied landscape.

Technical information




